Hello Sunshine District!

I have been busy assessing the activities that we can start or restart in the district to support both choruses and quartets.

We had a very successful ZOOM LEADAC combined with the Carolina District with a strong showing from several chapters in the Sunshine District. The training material and some videos from LEADAC are available through the district website.

The first area I want to work in the district is the support we can provide to the quartets through a District Quartet/Chorus committee to develop events and opportunities for our quartets to get development training, coaching and singing opportunities.

Steve Culpepper stepped down as the quartet chairman. Thank you, Steve, for your past support.

So, I sent a district wide email looking for a new chairman and committee members to help drive the ideas and events for all things quartet (all quartets, seniors, novice, and everything in between) especially training, questions, and district support. I have few interested individuals, and we will be meeting at the Spring convention to discuss the committee's direction. If you are interested in participating, please email me. The committee will also be supporting musical aspects for choruses also to include director coaching and chorus coaching events.

Steve Cragg is the Youth in Harmony Chairman and manages the Harmony Explosion (HX) Camp and providing support to any chapter(s)

that wish to host and sponsor a youth in harmony event, if requested. We are looking for financial support for the HX camp as the grants the district has received in the past have shrunk or dried up. So, if you or your chapter can offer support to this event please contact **Steve Cragg**.

I am also looking to assist the development of quartets and will be holding an event at the Spring convention to discuss and take action for quartet formation. Check the program for time and place.

In reviewing the Coaches Guild list on the website, I believe some revamping is in order. So, if you are a certified judge current or retired, certified society coach, top five international quartet member, or a top ten international chorus director, we would like to place you in the coaching guild. If you are willing to participate and assist the district choruses or quartets, please contact me.

In order to assist your chapter in a small way, I can arrange for a director workshop for your chapter. The workshop last 6 to 8 hours and includes coaching and practice directing, and a director collaboration session. The cost is \$75 per director. Please have your president, secretary or director contact me for more information. Workshops are open to all chapter directors and assistant directors, or whoever is waving their arms in front of the chorus.

Tech Notes - Singing Valentines a la Google

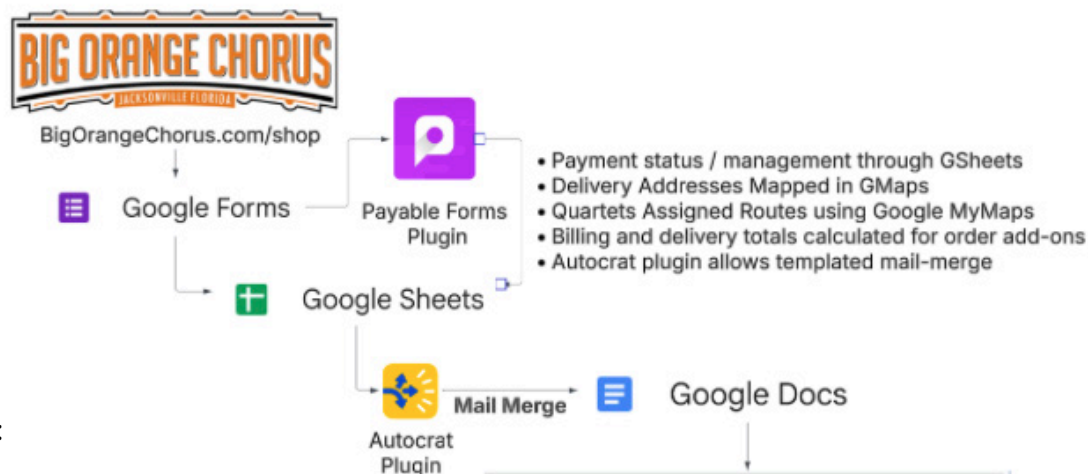
For Singing Valentine management this year, I helped the Big Orange Chorus migrate away from our own hosted website shopping cart and onto a Google Workspace solution. The main reason the board wanted this migration was to save on the various costs around SSL certificates and shopping cart licences, as well as the effort of managing payment processors.

Secondary benefits included using the robust distributed ecosystem of GWorkspace apps where each stakeholder can have direct access to the data and processing methods. For example, we could all be mulling over the same quartet assignments tab at the same time from our respective machines.

Hopefully some of the below may be useful or at least give you some ideas if you're looking for additional automation in your ordering systems, or are considering moving into the Cloud with it.

BigO sells 2 types of Valentines, Virtual via email, and In-Person. For simplicity during user checkout, we built each type into its own form, each with their own spreadsheet and plugins.

Shown here is an overview diagram of what we used this year. It relied on 2 very useful and free plugins: Payable Forms and Autocrat.



A VERY brief description:

Our website sent purchasers to our Google form, where they gave us the details for their Singing Valentine delivery. The form options included prices, and the Payable plugin converted those form submissions into invoices. Payable generated and presented the user with a custom invoice page and sent them an email to it for future use and to serve as a receipt: (shown on the next page)



On that invoice / receipt page, the buyer can pay via whatever payment sources we prefer and allow. Payable supports many sources. We had little issues with Square for payment processing, but your mileage may vary.

Google Forms already stores the submission results into a Google Sheets worksheet, and the Payable plugin interface uses that same spreadsheet for easy management of refunds, cash payment recording, and the like.

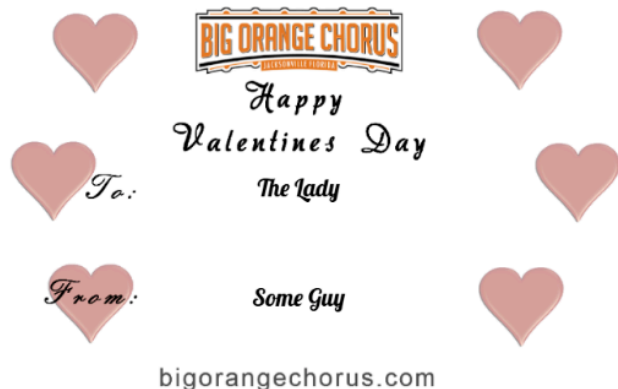
Yay Spreadsheets!

We then created a few other sheets and tabs based on that data. These enabled us to do plenty of necessary spreadsheet-like things to our order data:

- ♪ Count extra flowers and candy needed,
- ♪ Assign delivery addresses to geo regions and then regions to quartets.
- ♪ Give quartets their lists of deliveries for the day

And a few things that were made easier within Google Sheets and Workspace specifically:

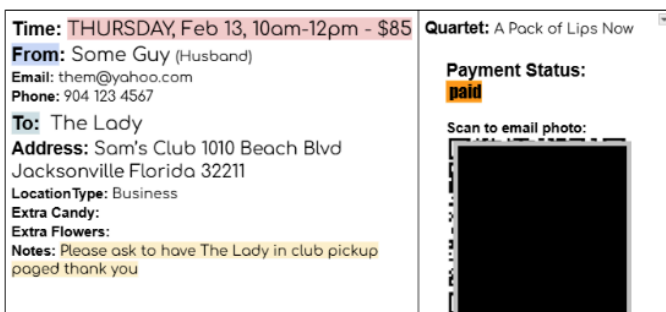
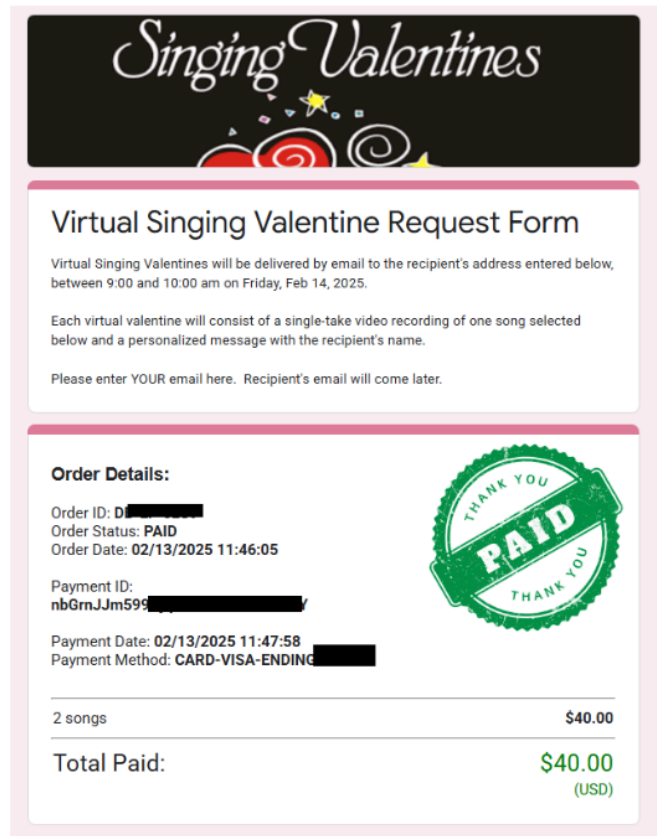
- ♪ Hotlink to google maps right in the cell from an address chip
- ♪ Generated a mailto:link unique to each buyer, prefilled with the subject, address, CC, and email message text from the buyer's initial form response.
- ♪ Rendered a QR code for the above link, for printing on delivery cards.



The Autocrat plugin allowed me to create a single-page template and then generate a unique Google Doc for each order. This document was printed on cardstock and perforated, and served two purposes: The top half was handed to the Vals recipient as a greeting card along with their candy and flower. The bottom half included the necessary delivery info for the quartet: (see image on bottom left)

This was a new process for us this year, and worked pretty well all things considered. We'll be starting on improvements for next year soon!

The BigO is continuing to use Google Forms and the Payable plugin for show tickets, shirt orders, and other events where we need to accept money from the public or members online. If you have experience you'd like to share, or are looking for ways Google Workspace can help your singing unit, please reach out.



Sunshine District Spring Convention

It's time to enter the BHS Quartet Prelims, Seniors Quartet Championships, Youth Quartet Championships, and the Sunshine District Chorus Championships.

Barberscore is open for entries! Entry window closes promptly at noon on April 11th. That's plenty of time to check that your quartet is registered and memberships are up-to-date, and to nudge your chapter leadership into bringing your chorus to the convention. As I've said so many times before, it's the best opportunity to perform in front of the most appreciative and supportive crowd there is. The coaching afterward from our esteemed panel of musical, vocal, and performance experts will definitely be worth the effort.

Chapter leaders - Remember, the minimum number of performers was changed to just 9 instead of 12. This will help some of our smaller groups to be able to participate without having to worry so much about getting that 12th person to join you on stage. (If you only have an octet, let me know. We'll find you a new member or I'll join your chapter.)

Please reach out to me privately if you have any problems with Barberscore or need help convincing a reluctant tenor or shy bass to get a shine on his/her/their shoes and a melody in his/her/their heart, and join us for all of the fun that comes with a SUN Convention.

Also, as the DRCJ (District Representative to Contest and Judging) I rely on you to tell me of any scheduling conflicts, special needs, or requests using the provided section in Barberscore when you input your entry. Please note anything you think might be helpful to know so we can arrange a great contest for you.

Where are our Juniors and Seniors quartets? We need more than one quartet in the Friday-only round to make it a true contest. Let's see some Sunshine Senior Pride! (Hmmm...good quartet name for the taking) Let's encourage our music educators to send a quartet to the contest. How about asking your chapter to

sponsor a youth quartet? (Hey, Sunshine Senior Pride also works for a Highschool quartet...)

In all seriousness, we need quartets and choruses to make a convention like this work. It's not too late to call up the new gang from the LDJ hallway, pick four songs, and register a clever name. (Like the one I gave you in this article.)

It's also not too late to talk to your chapter leaders to remind them how you miss hitting the stage and spending time with other barbershoppers. I miss cruising around all of the chapter hospitality rooms, but I miss getting on stage even more.
